









Nova Era Vocal Ensemble presents the **fourth edition** of Lisbon Choral Conducting Masterclass from the **31st August to the 3rd of September 2023** for conductors, music teachers, students, and choral enthusiasts, giving them the opportunity to work with experienced conductors.

The course is designed to respond to the needs of all students – **from beginners to established conductors** – and therefore **three levels are offered**, where participants will develop and refine their core skills in choral conducting. There is a strict limit of participants for each level.

Two selected students of each level will be offered the opportunity to work in a **joint session with the other levels' conductors** as well as the three choirs singing together. All participants will have the chance to **perform in the final concert** of the Masterclass. The students will receive a participation certificate and the recording of the final concert.

This course also welcomes the ones who simply wish to learn by observing and listening. This kind of application is available for all levels. The Masterclass will be given in **English**, and will take place at **Iscte - Instituto Universitário de Lisboa**.



Nova Era is a vocal ensemble that brings together 28 singers. The ensemble was founded by João Barros in 2019. In the last few years, Nova Era has premiered pieces from composers such as Alfredo Teixeira, Eugénio Rodrigues, Gerson Batista, Hugo Vasco Reis, Georgi Sztojanov, João Viegas, Helga Arias, André Mota, João Fonseca e Costa, Manuel Moreira, Bernardo Beirão, among others.

Recently, Nova Era has performed choral masterpieces from the history of music like "Cantique des Cantiques" by Daniel Lesur, "Mass for double choir" by Frank Martin, "Messe en Sol majeur" by Francis Poulenc, "Canticle of the Sun" by Tõnu Kõrvits and Bach's motets.

In 2021, the choir took part in the ceremony for the quincentenary of the death of King Manuel I - Light to D. Manuel, at Mosteiro dos Jerónimos, upon invitation by Massimo Mazzeo. In the same year, Nova Era participated in the recording of the album "Voices and Landscapes" by the portuguese composer Hugo Vasco Reis, with the piece "Sleeping Landscapes.

Nova Era Vocal Ensemble is the main ensemble of the Lisbon Choral Conducting Masterclass. Throughout the different editions, collaborated with Bernie Sherlock, Josep Vila, Pedro Teixeira, Gonçalo Lourenço, Inês Tavares Lopes and Marcos Cerejo.

Nova Era Schola is a musical project established in January 2020. Being part of Nova Era Schola choir gives young singers an opportunity to develop musically and vocally in a professional environment. Each singer has individual vocal lessons on weekly basis and also gets a chance to work with singers of Nova Era Vocal Ensemble. The training doesn't consist only of vocal practice but also of sight reading and score analysis. Nova Era Schola is an opportunity for the singers to grow and eventually become part of Nova Era Vocal Ensemble based on their development and ability. The choir is led by the conductor Marcos Cerejo and Mónica Beltrão is the personal vocal coach.





The **Iscte Choir** was established in 2015. It is formed by Iscte community members (students, alumni, teachers, researchers and other employees) and is also open to people with no connection to this institution. Its main objective is to promote the practice of choral music and the deepening of musical knowledge. The choir is led by the conductor João Barros.

Dedicated to **beginners**, **with no previous knowledge or little experience**in choral conducting. It will mainly focus on good posture and the basic notions of conducting. The participants will develop confidence and conducting skills.
